

Rules and Regulations of the School: Contd...

Ragging includes:

- Physical or psychological harassment of junior students by seniors
- Forced tasks, intimidation, or humiliation
- Both are considered serious offenses and are dealt with as per CBSE Circular No. 17/2009 and anti-ragging laws.

4. Disciplinary Action for Misconduct or Bullying

Depending on severity and recurrence, action may include:

- Oral or written warnings • Parent-teacher/principal meeting • Written apology or undertaking
- Temporary suspension • Detention or extra disciplinary duties • Expulsion (in severe or repeated cases)
- FIR or legal action (in extreme cases of violence or ragging)

5. Role of the School Authorities

Disciplinary Committee to handle behavioral issues.

Incident records and maintained and notified CBSE in cases of serious offenses.

Counseling support offered where necessary.

6. Complaint & Reporting Mechanism

Students or parents can report misconduct to:

Class teacher • School counselor

• Principal • Anti-bullying committee. Discipline Committee

7. Impact on Records

• Serious disciplinary issues may be:

• Noted in the student's personal record • Reported to CBSE if required (especially for Class 10 & 12)

• Affect promotion or Board exam eligibility in extreme cases

G. Rules & Regulations for Using School Buses in a CBSE School

1. Eligibility & Enrollment for Bus Use

• Students must register in advance to avail school transport.

• Bus seats are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis or based on route feasibility.

• A transport fee is charged and must be paid as per school policy.

2. Timings and Routes

• Students must be present at their designated bus stops at least 5–10 minutes before the scheduled time.

• Buses will not wait beyond the designated time.

• Parents are responsible for dropping/picking students to/from the stop.

3. Right to Bus Stop and Timings

The school reserves the right to:

• Fix, alter, or discontinue bus routes and stops based on:

• Operational feasibility • Safety concerns • Low occupancy on certain routes

• Traffic or road conditions • Changes in school hours or session timings

• Change bus timelings with prior notice due to:

• Weather conditions • Government orders • Exams or special events

Note: Any changes will be notified in advance via circulars, BIPS Connect app. However, emergency changes may be communicated at short notice.

4. Student Conduct on the Bus

• Maintain discipline and silence during travel. • Remain seated properly at all times.

• No shouting, running, or misbehavior. • Do not throw objects or tamper with equipment.

• Follow the instructions of the bus attendant/driver.

5. Misconduct in Buses

Consequences include:

• Warning or suspension from transport service • Parent meeting

• Permanent removal from bus service for repeated behavior

6. Disclaimer & Acknowledgment

• Parents are required to sign a declaration acknowledging:

• Acceptance of route and time changes by the school.

• That the school will not be responsible for delays due to traffic or unavoidable circumstances.

• That students will follow bus conduct rules.

H. Rules & Regulations for Parents Visiting CBSE Schools

1. Proper Dress Code

• Parents must visit the school in modest, respectful, and culturally appropriate attire.

• Clothing should reflect the dignity of the educational environment.

• Revealing, flashy, or offensive clothing is discouraged.

2. Etiquette for Teachers and Staff

• Parents are expected to:

• Maintain respect and courtesy in all interactions with school staff.

• Avoid raising voices, arguments, or aggressive behavior.

• Address concerns through formal communication channels.

• Any disputes must be handled professionally and respectfully through the school principal or grievance redressal committee.

3. Tobacco, Smoking, and Substance Use

• Strictly prohibited on school premises, including:

• Smoking tobacco or gutka • Smoking cigarettes or using e-cigarettes/vapes

• Possession or use of any intoxicating substances

Violation will lead to immediate removal from campus and possible blacklisting from future visits.

4. Mobile Phone Use

• Mobile phones must be switched off or kept on silent mode while inside the school premises.

• Phone use is not allowed during meetings with teachers or during school events.

• Taking photos, videos, or recordings on campus is prohibited unless explicitly permitted by school authorities.

5. Visiting Hours & Permissions

• Parents must:

• Visit the school only during designated visiting hours or by prior appointment.

• Report at the reception/security gate and register their entry.

• Wear a visitor badge or pass when required.

• Unscheduled visits during school hours may not be entertained unless in an emergency.

6. Prohibited Conduct

Parents must not:

• Enter the school or staff rooms without permission.

• Attempt to discipline or reprimand any student other than their own child.

• Engage in political, religious, or commercial promotion within school premises.

• Interfere in the school's daily administration or classroom routines.

7. Vehicle Parking and Traffic Safety

• Parents must:

• Park only in designated visitor parking areas. • Not block entrances, exits, school buses, or other vehicles.

• Avoid double parking or parking on footpaths and no-parking zones.

• Turn off the engine when parked near the school gate.

8. Safe Driving Near School Premises

• Drive slowly and carefully (generally below 20 km/h) in the school zone.

• No honking, rash driving, or sudden turns near the school gates.

• Avoid using traffic cameras near the school security guards.

9. Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up Protocol

• Drop children only at the designated gated-drop-off zone.

• Do not enter the school campus with a vehicle, unless authorized.

• Avoid crowding or lingering at the school gate during start or dismissal times.

10. Consequences of Misconduct

• Violation of these rules may result in:

• Written warning or formal notice • Restricted entry to campus

• In serious cases, cancellation of child's admission if safety or school discipline is compromised

• Police involvement for threats or physical aggression

I. Guidelines for Parents: Supporting Your Child's Learning at Home

1. Importance of Practicing Homework

- Homework reinforces what is taught in class and helps students practice and internalizes concepts.
- Encourage your child to:
- Complete homework regularly and on time. • Take responsibility for their work to develop self-discipline.

2. Value of Self-Study

- Self-study helps students understand topics deeply and identify areas they find difficult.
- It builds independence, confidence, and critical thinking skills.

3. Benefits of Reading at Morning is Beneficial

- Morning reading enhances concentration and mental alertness for the rest of the day.
- Encourage your child to:

• Read newspapers, storybooks, or educational material for 20–30 minutes in the morning.

• Discuss what they read to improve communication skills.

• Reading habits established early promote lifelong learning and curiosity.

4. Importance of Practicing Mathematics Daily

- Mathematics requires regular practice to develop problem-solving abilities and logical thinking.
- Consistent practice improves speed, accuracy, and confidence.

5. Supporting your Child by:

• Encouraging them to solve daily math problems or mental math exercises.

• Helping with difficult questions, but let them try independently first.

• Using math puzzles or puzzles to make learning fun.

• Employers that practice helps overcome math anxiety and builds a strong foundation for future learning.

Tips for Parents to Motivate Students

- Praise effort and progress, not just results. • Set a positive example by reading and learning yourself.
- Communicate regularly with teachers to monitor progress.

• Avoid excessive pressure; encourage balance with hobbies and rest.

• Celebrate milestones to keep motivation high.

J. Rules & Regulations for Admission Withdrawal from a CBSE School

1. Submission of Withdrawal Application

• Parents must submit a written application for withdrawal to the school principal.

• Admission withdrawal application is usually collected from March 15 to April 15 and any withdrawal application received later to this is not accepted until the fees of current term is not cleared.

• Submission of withdrawal application is available at office.

2. Clearance of Fees

• All outstanding dues (fees, library books, etc.) must be cleared before withdrawal.

• The Transfer Certificate (TC) and original documents are usually issued only after clearance of dues.

• The transfer certificate is not given by hand. It is sent to the transferring school via speed/registered post only.

3. Transfer Certificate (TC) Rules

• As per CBSE Bye-Laws:

• Transfer Certificate is issued within 15 days of receiving the application.

• Delay beyond 15 days when dues aren't cleared by the parent is not the responsibility of the school.

• TC must be countersigned by the relevant CBSE or state education authority if the student is moving to another state or country. Thus time required to issue TC in such situation may be more than usual.

4. Report Card Certificate

• The final term mark sheet/report card, along with a Character Certificate if requested is possible only when dues are cleared and in case of admission withdrawal the formalities are completed.

5. Mid-Year Withdrawals

• Allowed, but:

• Refund fees is not done. • It is required to pay full term fees.

6. Special Cases Requiring CBSE Involvement

• Withdrawal from Classes 10 during the Board year may need CBSE notification, especially if the student is moving to another CBSE-affiliated school.

• In such cases, the new school must obtain CBSE permission for direct admission.

7. Migration Certificate (for Class 10 & 12 students)

• If the student is withdrawing after Class 10 and moving to another board, a Migration Certificate can be requested from the CBSE (via the school or online).

Other Important aspects

1. Summer Holidays

For Nursery, LKG, UKG, 1st and 2nd Std : 5 June to 5 June

For 3rd to 8th Std : April 15 to June 2nd. • For 9th and 10th : April 25 to May 25

2. Mid term Holidays (For all Classes) : Mahanavami to Balipadma

During the school Diary to school every day is compulsory. If lost a new diary must be purchased from the store immediately.

4. Every student must wear the identity card. If lost a new ID card can be issued, within 10 days after paying the charges.

5. Parents need not wait for PTM dates to be announced. You can take an appointment and meet Principal to discuss your concerns on any working day. Appointment is necessary to save your time during visit.

6. Means of Contacting Teachers/Principal/ Any other Staff Via Phone : Teachers are not allowed to keep the phones during working hours. Thus you are advised to make any telephone contact off the school working hours but before 6:30pm. During the telephonic conversation ensure that the conversation remains respectful, brief and polite. Do not drag the calls or repeat the same statements unnecessarily. Avoid telephonic calls in the morning in emergencies.

7. For any queries related to Bus timings or issues related to transportation contact the transport in-charge only.

8. Pay the fees via BIPS CONNECT APP or visit the office and download/collect your receipts. Never give cash to someone to pay the fees on behalf of you. The school is not responsible if the money is lost in such events.

9. School has right to take action in case when you fail to pay the fees in the stipulated time.

10. School Gates remain closed once all the students enter the premises for safety and security reasons. Thus be patient during your visits and cooperate respectfully with Security Personnel. They are guardians assigned to ensure safety.

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

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SCHOOL

A. New Admissions

1. Age Criteria

- Pre-Primary (Nursery/LKG/UKG): Minimum age is 3+ years for Nursery.
- Class 1: The child should be 6+ years as of 31st May of the academic year of admission.
- Age requirements increase accordingly for higher classes.

2. Admission Procedure

- Classes Nursery to 8: Admission is based on written test (for UKG to 8th Std) and followed by interaction/interview (for parents and child). Class Playhome and LKG: May involve an interview only.
- Class 9 and 10: Admission is generally not allowed unless the student is transferring from another CBSE school (as per CBSE Byelaws).

3. Documents Required

- Birth Certificate (for primary classes)
- Transfer Certificate (from the previous school)
- Report Card/Mark Sheet of previous class
- Admit card (student and parents)
- Passport-size photographs (student and parents)
- Address proof
- Caste certificate (if applicable)

4. Admission to Class 9 and 10

- Only allowed if:
- The student is transferring from another CBSE-affiliated school.
- Permission is granted by the CBSE Regional Office.
- Admission is not allowed after 25th of April.

5. Priority

- We may give preference to siblings, children of alumni, staff members, or local residents in case when limited seats are available.

6. Fees

- Admission involves: • Admission Fee, • Tuition Fee, • No donations

B. Rules and Regulations for Punctuality and Regularity

1. School Timings & Punctuality

- Students must report to school on time every day.

Latecomers may be:

- Marked late in the attendance register. • Required to present a late arrival slip signed by a school authority.

Subject to disciplinary action if habitual tardiness is observed.

2. Daily Attendance

Attendance is compulsory on all working days, including school functions and national holidays like Independence Day and Republic Day.

A student is excused from morning assembly.

3. Minimum Attendance Requirement

- Students must have at least 95% attendance in the academic year to be eligible to appear for the Board Exam (Class 10 & 12).

• Shortage may be condoned up to 20% (i.e., down to 75%) only in exceptional cases with valid documents (e.g., medical emergencies, participation in national-level events).

4. Leave Rules

- All leaves must be informed in advance and supported by a written application signed by parents/guardians.

• In case of sick leave exceeding 3 days, a medical certificate may be required.

• Unauthorized or excessive absence can lead to: • Warning letters, • Parent-teacher meetings

• Removal of name from school rolls (in prolonged absence without intimation)

5. Rejoining After Long Absence

• If a student remains absent for more than 10 consecutive working days without informing the school:

• The student will visit the school, discuss the same with authorities and take approval from the principal to continue to attend the classes.

6. Half-day or Early Leave

• Students are not allowed to leave school early unless:

• A written request is submitted and approved by the class teacher/principal.

• The parent/guardian comes in person or gives verified permission.

• This is marked in the attendance records to track the practice becoming habitual.

7. Participation in School Activities

Regular participation in:

- Co-curricular activities, • Morning assemblies, • Field trips and events,

• Annual Day and other cultural activities, • Sports activities

is encouraged and often required as part of the overall assessment. However, participations advised but not forced.

Not Allowed / Disciplinary Notes

• Repeated tardiness or irregular attendance may result in:

• Detention from exams, • Loss of grades for internal assessment, • Disciplinary action as per school rules

• Fake leave notes or forging signatures are treated as serious misconduct.

C. Rules and Regulations: Dress Code, Uniform, Haircut, and Discipline

1. School Uniform

• Wearing the school uniform compulsorily on all working days and during official school functions.

Uniform should be:

• Neat, clean, and properly ironed. • Worn with identity card/lanyard, wherever applicable

• Specific shoes, socks, and accessories (belts, ties, etc.) must conform to school standards

• Every student must wear at least one pair of suitable shoes to avoid滑倒 in rainy season and it is expected that the student must be in Neat, clean, and properly ironed uniforms every day. However this is not applicable for House dress and Sports dress as they are worn only once in a week.

• Shoes and socks must be clean and wearing torn or any other design is not allowed.

• Uniform must be of suitable size fitting the student. Too big, too small or modified designs, re stitched for modern attire is not allowed.

Seasonal Variations:

• The sweaters worn in the winter are supposed to be of specific design prescribed by the school.

Special Days: Casual dress allowed on birthdays must be modest and appropriate.

2. Haircut and Grooming

Boys:

• Must maintain short, neat, and well-groomed hair.

• Fancy hairstyles, coloring, or spikes are not allowed.

• Applying hair oil enhances your appearance

Girls:

• Long hair should be tied neatly in braids or ponytails, with specific colored ribbons.

• Hair coloring, streaking, or fancy hairstyles are discouraged and strictly prohibited.

• Boy cuts and not permitted. If you are not comfortable you can keep short hair.

• Applying hair oil enhances your appearance

3. Personal Hygiene:

• Nails must be trimmed and clean.

• No nail polish, makeup, or henna (unless culturally or religiously required with prior approval).

4. Accessories and Appearance

• Jewelry: Only simple studs or small earrings may be permitted for girls; boys are usually not allowed to wear any ornaments. Avoid wearing valuable metals and stones. School is not responsible if any student misses their ornaments.

• Smartwatches, expensive items, and gadgets are strictly prohibited.

• No tattoos or body art (permanent or temporary) are allowed.

5. Discipline and Conduct

• Students must:

• Be respectful to teachers, staff, and peers. • Avoid foul language, bullying, or physical aggression

• Maintain silence and order during classes & assemblies. • Not damage school property (strict penalties apply)

6. Use of Mobile Phones and Gadgets

• Mobile phones are generally not allowed for students.

• If found, the device may be confiscated and returned only to parents only after taking an undertaking letter.

• Repeated violations may lead to suspension or disciplinary action.

• Bringing of harmful/dangerous objects of any kind to school is strictly prohibited.

7. Consequences for Violation

- First violation: Warning or note in diary. • Repeated violations: Detention, parent call, or suspension
- Serious misconduct (violence, cheating, substance use): Immediate suspension or expulsion, with CBSE being notified in extreme cases

D. Rules & Regulations for Students Driving 2-Wheelers or 4-Wheelers in CBSE Schools (During or after School Hours)

1. Legal Driving Age & Licensing

• Two-Wheelers: Minimum age is 18+ years with a valid driving license.

• Two-Wheelers (motor-powered, e.g., scooters up to 50cc): Legal at 16+ years, with a valid Learner's License.

• Students below the legal age or without a license are strictly prohibited from driving any vehicle to school.

2. Prohibition on Underage Driving

• Underage students driving to school is illegal under the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988.

• Schools must:

• Not allow underage students to bring vehicles to campus.

• Inform parents and authorities if such incidents occur.

• Impose disciplinary action (warnings, suspensions, or fines).

3. School Campus Regulations

• No student may:

• Ride or drive a vehicle within the school campus .

• Try to get into over speed riding or wheeling of bicycles.

• Park personal bicycles inside the school premises unless a designated area exists and permission is granted.

• School is not responsible for loss or damage to unauthorized parked vehicles.

4. Parental Responsibility

• Parents must:

• Ensure their child is not driving illegally. • Be held accountable in case of legal violations or accidents.

5. Disciplinary Consequences

• First offense:

• Written warning, notification to parents, and possible fine. • Repeated or serious offense:

• Suspension, cancellation of school transport privileges, or report to traffic authorities.

• If an accident or injury occurs due to illegal driving:

• The student and parents must inform the local police and CBSE Regional Office if necessary.

Note: Parents should ensure that their wards never drive 2 wheelers/ 4 wheelers keeping their safety and safety of the public. This rule is to be followed during and even off the school hours. If any student is found violating the rule it will result into strict actions.

6. Involvement of Authorities

• CBSE has advised schools to cooperate with local traffic police to discourage underage or unsafe driving.

E. Rules & Regulations for Attendance and Punctuality on Exam Days – CBSE Schools

1. Mandatory Attendance on Exam Days

• Students must attend all exams compulsorily. • No leave is granted on the day of an examination.

• Students missing an exam must:

• Submit a written explanation signed by parents. • Provide a medical certificate (if due to illness).

• However there shall be no retest on any circumstances.

2. Reporting Time (Punctuality)

• Latecomers may be:

• Denied entry if they arrive after the exam start time (for all exam either internal or annual exams or in Board Exams).

• Not given extra time to complete the paper. • Subject to a disciplinary note or warning if the delay is habitual.

3. Admit Card & Identification

• Students must carry their:

• Admit card (for Board exams) • School ID card (for internal exams)

• The student is allowed in the exam hall without valid identification.

4. Prohibited Behavior on Exam Days

• Use of unfair means (cheating), carrying notes or unauthorized materials into the exam hall is strictly prohibited.

• Students found violating rules are subject to:

• Cancellation of exam • Disqualification • Report to CBSE in Board exam cases

5. Entry and Exit Rules

• Enter into the exam hall:

• Must be quiet and orderly • Late entry may be denied after the scheduled time

• Exit from the exam hall:

• Allowed only after the completion of the minimum exam duration.

• Students cannot leave exam unless permitted under special circumstances.

6. Attendance Criteria for Appearing in Exams

• Minimum of 60% attendance in the academic year/75% with valid reasons and certificates).

• In case of shortage, the student may be disallowed from appearing in the Board exam unless:

• Valid reasons are submitted (medical, participation in national events, etc.)

• Approved by the CBSE Regional Office via the school

F. Rules & Regulations for Misconduct, Behavioral Issues, Bullying, and Ragging in CBSE Schools

1. General Conduct Expectations

• Students must:

• Show respect and courtesy to all staff and fellow students.

• Maintain discipline and decorum inside and outside the classroom.

• Follow all school rules, instructions, and the code of conduct outlined in the school diary or handbook.

2. Definition of Misconduct

Misconduct includes (but is not limited to):

• Use of abusive language • Disobedience, disrespect, or insubordination • Damaging school property

• Damage to school property • Forgery of signatures or documents

• Possession or use of banned items (e.g. sharp objects, mobile phones, weapons, drugs)

3. Bullying & Ragging – Strictly Prohibited

Bullying includes:

• Verbal abuse, name-calling, teasing • Physical violence or threats • Exclusion or social manipulation

• Cyberbullying (online harassment) :

Note: Students are not allowed to create social media accounts. Parents are held responsible in case of their ward uses social media to harass any one.
